- **Maintain Sprinkler & Irrigation Systems**

Irrigation Reminders -

How to track how much water your irrigation system uses.

- Read your irrigation water meter before you run a cycle.
- When cycle is done, read your meter again. This will tell you how many gallons of water you are using during one cycle.
- Take the difference, round down to the nearest 1000 gallons and multiply by \$5.74.

- **Understanding how much water you use on lawn irrigation can prevent water waste and an unanticipated high water bill.**

SPRING CODE ENFORCEMENT & REMINDERS

Be a good neighbor and help Mayer maintain a higher quality of life, safety and property value within our community. Often residents are not aware of city codes that affect your property. The following is a summary of items that arise most often in Mayer. For more information on maintaining your property and home, visit the City website at www.cityofmayer.com.

Lawns

Grass and weeds cannot be taller than 12 in height. To keep grass and weeds less than 12 inches, mowing must be conducted weekly during the months of May through October.

Exterior Storage

Furniture, appliances, car toppers, car parts, building materials, brush, junk, debris and miscellaneous items not meant for outdoor storage and daily use cannot be stored outside or in your yard.

House Maintenance

Houses must be kept in sound condition and free from deterioration. All house numbers must be visible from the street. If emergency personnel cannot find your home in a timely manner, it could be a difference between life and death.

Garbage Services

All properties must have garbage and recycling services. Garbage containers must be placed and removed from the curbs within 24 hours of pickup. Please do not overfill container. Keep lid closed to prevent garbage from blowing out.

Sump Pumps

Sump pumps should drain into the yard or be hooked to a drain tile. They CANNOT be hooked into the Sanitary Sewer collection system.

Sheds and Fences

Please remember that all fences and sheds require zoning permits. Sheds over 200 square feet also require a building permit. Building and Zoning Permits can be downloaded from the City Website. All electrical permits must be applied for through the State of Minnesota.
